According to Global Environment Centre, Malaysian produced **23,000 tonnes of solid waste** in a daily basis while only **5% is recycled.**










Train-the-Trainer


We invited partners to provide training for the Virtual Volunteers in order to build up the quality of trainer before delivering the online workshop.

EcoBrick Challenge

EcoBricks Challenge has been assigned to local virtual volunteers (LVV). Each and every LVV has to complete at least two 500mL Eco-bricks bottles within three weeks' time.

The **objective** of this challenge is to raise awareness and encourage people to practise eco-bricks lifestyle as this small action can contribute in reducing plastic wastes and making an impact on the environmental sustainability".

Total EcoBricks collected: 7 Eco-bricks out of 7 LVVs

Criteria of Eco-Bricks

- At least two 500mL
 Eco-bricks bottles are completed
- Reach the minimum weight for the passable ecobrick















We challenged and guided the Virtual Volunteers to create an awareness video related to the environmental issues.

The **objective** of this challenge is to further inculcate environmental awareness in the community through social media such as Facebook and Instagram by using the awareness video created by them.

2 Online Workshops






