

Global issues which will be addressed.




Unlike a lot of problems, climate change has a solution. But only if we unite to overcome the hardships.


Education


The process of facilitating learning, or the acquisition of knowledge



Global Education

Global education crisis is costing the UN \$129 billion a year. Ten per cent of global spending on primary education is being lost on poor quality education that is failing to ensure that children learn.
