Introduction

- A constitution is:
 - a collection of measures and guidelines for regulating the administration of a country
 - a source of legislation in the country that is permanently supreme.
- Malaysian Constitution is a written constitution, which is supported by various additional documents to strengthen the action of the Constitution

Why we need constitution?

- 1. To ensure administration continuity and political stability.
- 2. To avoid irregularity of abuse of power by ruling bodies.
- 3. The question of **fundamental rights and freedom** is **recorded** in the Constitution.
- 4. The Constitution requires **Malaysian citizens** to give **undivided loyalty** to the country.
- 5. The Constitution also provides **special rights for indigenous communities**

Types of Constitution

1) Written Constitution [√]

- A single document that covers 3 main elements:
- a. Supreme law, hard to ammended.
- b. Parliament has the power to make, enact laws.
- c. Interpretation of constitution in the hands of Judiciary, to protect the constitution.

2) Unwritten Constitution

- Not collected in one single document.
- Examples: Parliament Act, courts judgements, custom (adat), etc.

The Superiority of Constitution

- The 3rd principle of the Rukun Negara
- It is the only source of law that is permanently supreme.
- The superiority of the constitution is very important because it will help the federation government to run things smoothly without having to compete with others.
- Its overrides the power of Yang di-Pertuan Agong, Parliament and the courts

Uniqueness of Malaysian Constitution

 The Malaysian Constitution covers all the legislative, executive and judiciary aspects and has special provision to apply in a country with a diversity of races and religions.

It is complete and comprehensive

Main Features of Malaysian Constitution

- 1. Malaysia is a Federation
- 2. Malaysia is a constitutional Monarchy
- 3. Malaysia is a country that **practices parliamentary democracy**
- 4. Religious freedom with Islam as the official religion of Malaysia

Main Features of Malaysian Constitution

- 5. Supremacy of the Constitution and the rule of law
- Doctrine of the separation of power in which the judiciary, the legislative and the government each has its freedom to carry out its different functions with no conflict of interest
- 7. Validity and transparency of the Judiciary with exclusive powers subject to the provisions of the Constitution
- 8. National Language, citizenship, and the special rights of the Malays and the native tribes of Sabah and Sarawak

Federal & State Constitution

- Malaysia is a federation country with 13 states and four Federal Territories.
- Thus, division of power was provided in the Malaysian Constitution between the Federal Government and the State Governments.
- The separation of power aim to ensure the smooth operation of the federal system and to avoid disputes.
- The power of Fed. Government is mentioned in the Federal List - covers matters of national interest such as foreign affairs, defense, internal security, citizenship, education, commerce, industry and health

Federal & State Constitution

- The power of State Government is mentioned in the State List such as Islamic affairs, land, agriculture, forestry, local government and local services
- Common List / Concurrent list matters that require for cooperation between both Federal and State governments such as social welfare, scholarships, national parks, wildlife, drainage, irrigation and town and village planning

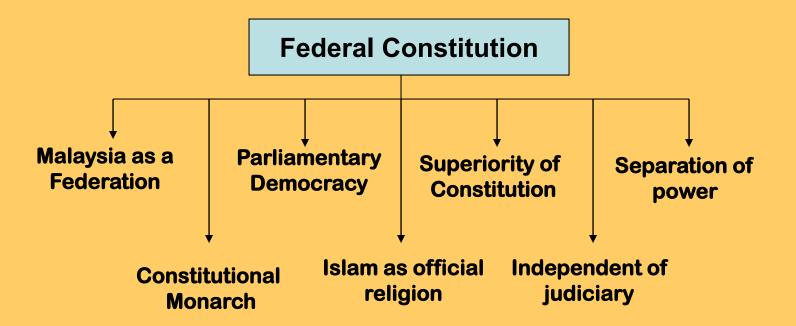
What is the list of power for Malaysia federal government in Malaysia constitution?

Answer

National interest such as:

- foreign affairs,
- defense,
- internal security,
- citizenship,
- education,
- commerce,
- industry
- health

FEDERAL CONSTITUTION



- Article 159 of the Federation Constitution permitted an amendment to be made upon the Constitution.
- Since 1957, the Malaysian Constitution had been amended for 22 times until the end of 1982
- The aim is to add, improve or abolish a provision which is felt not relevant anymore according to the time and the people's need.
- The amendment is done through Parliament as have been explained in Article 159 and Article 161 (E).
- Not set and rigid but alive

- 3 ways/ procedures of amendment and matters involved:-
- a) Article 159 (4) some matters can be emended with 2/3 majority voice in every Council of Parliament without others approval.
 - i. Merging of states into the Federation.
 - ii. Appointment and retirement of Dewan Negara members.
 - iii. Matters that relates to power of making or enacting laws in the Parliament

- b) Article 161 (E) certain matters that give importance to Sabah and Sarawak that can be amended by 2/3 majority with the approval from Yang Dipertua Negeri Sarawak and Sabah.
 - i. Membership and power of High Court of Sabah and Sarawak.
 - ii. Regarding **State List** religion, language, special position of Bumiputera.
 - iii.Immigration Act

- c) Certain matters can only be amended with 2/3 and more majority from the council of Parliament and approval from the Council of Rulers (Majlis Raja-raja).
 - i. Regarding citizenship
 - ii. Function and power of Council of Rulers
 - iii. Laws regarding changes in state border.

d) Usual majority voice in each Parliament – for matters not mentioned in the previous three.

- The reasons or rational of amendment:
 - 1. To maintain **efficient management** of the country's administration such as **standardizing the regulations of land matters** in the states of the federation
 - 2. To control the **country's peace** as happened several times to the regulation relating to the **internal security act**
 - 3. People's interest can be protected
